

Anderson School of Management Integrated BBA/MACCT Program



Admission Process: (Please refer to the UNM/ ASM Core Curriculum Requirements for Admission to the BBA program, commonly referred to as the 'purple sheet').

BBA:

Admission to the BBA program requires completion of all pre-admission course work with a "C" or better, a GPA of 2.5 on all pre-admission course work, and overall GPA of 2.5 on UNM or transfer work. Satisfactory completion of pre-admission courses and submission of the online application must meet published deadlines.

3/2 MACCT:

Students will apply when they are within 36 hours of completing their BBA with a minimum UNM GPA of 3.25 and have completed or have in progress MGMT 340, 341, 346, with a GPA of 3.5 or higher in those courses. GMAT scores will be waived and are not required. Students will be required to write an essay describing their reasons for pursuing an advanced degree in accounting.

Purpose:

This program will prepare students to obtain a Master of Accountancy and meet the 150-hour requirement to take the CPA exam in about five years at full time. This degree program is modeled after the 3-2 program but is aimed at ASM undergraduate students with a clear focus on accounting, tax accounting, or

Students will complete: **6 credit hours of non-accounting graduate** course work.
