Master of Accounting Advanced or Tax Concentration



ALL CONCENTRATION INFORMATION EFFECTIVE FOR STUDENTS ADMITTED FALL 2009 AND THEREAFTER.

The Advanced and Tax Concentrations are each a 33-hour program of study and designed for individuals who have **already earned a BBA with a concentration in accounting.**

The **Advanced Concentration** consists of a **minimum of 15 hours** of graduate accounting coursework and a **maximum of 24 hours** of graduate accounting coursework, plus a **minimum of 9 hours of non-accounting courses** at the graduate level (MGMT 697 ACCT Internship Recommended—Concentration advisor permission required—see Career Services Office). Within the 15-24 hours of accounting coursework, students may not take more than 6 hours of taxation coursework. (See chart on back side of this sheet.)

The **Tax Concentration** consists of a **minimum of 15 hours of graduate taxation accounting courses** and a **maximum of 24 hours of graduate accounting coursework**, plus a minimum of 9 hours of graduate level non-accounting courses. (See chart on back side of this sheet).

Coursework:

Students in the **Advanced & Tax Concentrations** may select from the following classes provided they have not taken the undergraduate equivalent. Please keep in mind the minimum and maximum taxation coursework guidelines for your respective concentration selection.

MGMT 643 - Governmental Accounting (Offered ONLINE in the summer semester)

Taxation Classes: (Advanced Concentration students are limited to a maximum of 6 hours in taxation coursework)

MGMT 542 - Seminar in Personal Tax Planning (offered Fall and Spring semester) (MGMT 342 undergraduate equivalent)
MGMT 543 - Seminar in Business Tax Planning (offered Fall semester) (MGMT 343 undergraduate equivalent)
MGMT 547 – Tax Research Procedures and Compliance (every other Fall semester)
MGMT 590 – Corporate Taxation (every other Spring semester)
MGMT 591 – Estate & Gift Taxation (visit with concentration faculty advisor about when this course may be offered)
MGMT 592 – Partnership and LLC Taxation (every other Fall semester)
MGMT 593 - Real Estate Taxation (every other Spring semester)
