## Master of Accounting Information Assurance

The Information Assurance Concentration is a 33-hour program of study and designed for individuals who have **already earned a BBA with a concentration in accounting.**

The **Information Assurance Concentration** consists of 24 hours of graduate accounting coursework and 9 hours of information assurance non-accounting coursework at the graduate level.

### **Coursework:**

Students in the Information Assurance concentration may select from the following required IA accounting and IA non-accounting courses provided they have not taken the undergraduate equivalent. Please keep in mind coursework guidelines for your selection.

MGMT 649 – Information Assurance Project Prereq: MGMT 336 or MGMT 636	Spring (online)

#### **Remaining course Requirements (if any):**

Students not meeting the overall concentration requirements with the above courses can do so with additional graduate accounting and non-accounting courses in consultation with the concentration advisor.
