## Master of Accounting Information Assurance

The Information Assurance Concentration is a 33-hour program of study and designed for individuals who have **already earned a BBA with a concentration in accounting.**

The Information Assurance Concentration consists of a **minimum of 15 hours** of graduate accounting coursework and a **maximum of 24 hours** of graduate accounting coursework, plus a **minimum of 9 hours of non-accounting courses** at the graduate level.
