Completing the MACCT Professional Concentration in 12 months is extremely difficult. You are encouraged to meet with the MACCT Concentration Advisor before starting the program.

The Department of Accounting will always offer the Professional Concentration coursework in the semesters indicated. Students can complete the program using any combination of classes in whatever length of time needed, keeping in mind when courses are offered and the seven-year rule described below:

The Anderson School of Management requires that all work used to meet degree requirements for a master's degree, including transfer credit, must be completed within a seven-year period immediately preceding the granting of the degree. Coursework older than seven years cannot be used to meet requirements for the master's degree. This rule does not apply to prerequisite/introductory coursework.

Students may fulfill introductory course requirements prior to admission to the Master of Accounting Program by taking up to 6 hours in non-degree student status. You may request a maximum of two (2) courses or six (6) semester hours of MACC graduate coursework while you hold non-degree student status. In order to continue taking courses beyond these six hours, you will need to be formally admitted into the Anderson Graduate School of Management in either the MBA or MACC program. Please visit with the Anderson School Graduate Programs Advisor for the process for requesting approval to enroll in Anderson classes if you are a non-degree student.
